Classroom Expectations:

Reading:

Assessments:

There are many ways in which we gather information about a student's progress throughout the year. Assessment tools we use include, but are not limited to, work samples, journals, daily observations, conferences, checklists, rubrics, reading records and self-evaluations.

Report Cards

There are three reporting periods throughout the year. Report cards will be sent home in December, April and June.

Newsletters/Calendars:

School newsletters are sent via email and updated on the school website approximately once a month. Our class will also release a monthly calendar, which will be sent home in your child's Message Folder. Parents/guardians are kept informed of upcoming events and other school initiatives, and activities.
