<i>Principals Report and Student Success Planning</i>	<i>School Summary</i> > <i>We have had a smooth start to the school year.</i> > <i>We have 21 classrooms and 2 pre-primary classes (Primary x1, Primary-One x2, One-Two x1, Grade Two x1 , Grade Two-Three x1, Grade Three x1, Grade Three-Four x1, Grade Four-Five x1, Grade Five x1, Grade Five-Six x2, Grade Six x1, Grade Seven x3, Grade Eight x2, Grade Nine x3)</i> > <i>Population is 456 to date (down from 473 last year)</i> > <i>We currently have 2.5 Learning Centre teachers and 1.5 Resource Teachers</i> > <i>Other news:</i> ● <i>We had a very well-attended Curriculum Night on September 1</i> ● <i>We hosted a spirited Stand Up Against Bullying Day on September 10</i> ● <i>Our first lockdown drill was such that even our RCMP members were impressed! This was hosted on Monday, September 14</i> ● <i>We had an assembly this morning about setting goals as guided by a guest speaker, and hosted our Terry Fox walk/run thereafter!</i> ● <i>Our JH Leadership Team, under the leadership of Ms. Rogers, are planning a school spirit week.</i>

	• <i>Our Breakfast Program was up and running on the first day of school, which is due to the teamwork of Ms. Dalrymple, Ms. Swan and all of our EPAs</i> <u>SSP-</u> <i>To improve in all areas, Math, Literacy, and Well Being, with a focus on students of African Canadian and Indigenous descent</i> <u>Literacy-</u> <i>We are starting the year with our June data in mind, and working to assess all Primary students toward Literacy skills (namely letter id) We have yet to meet as a literacy team: Resource, Literacy Support Teacher, SLP, Pr-2 classroom and Literacy Intervention Teacher with our SSP goal in mind, but we did meet to discuss the SLP and Psych caseloads for Cycle One.</i> <i>Margaret Kromminga, our literacy support teacher, is coaching and co-teaching in the elementary to create strong readers' and writers' workshop practices.</i> <u>Math-</u> <i>We are getting teachers set up for success with yearly plans, progression charts and assessment tools. We will soon plan how we will assess during short cycles of intervention.</i> <u>Well Being-</u> <i>We continue to do Fantastic Friday certificates to celebrate students' achievements and accomplishments with home! We also continue working hard to create safe spaces for all of our students, as you know.
