How will the teacher communicate homework?

Homework will be assigned randomly in the form of readings and responses on Google Classroom. Additionally, if classwork is not completed during class time, it will be assigned as homework. Reminders for these tasks will be posted on Google Classroom. The classroom code is found near the end of this document. Students will be prompted to sign up during class within the first week of school.

What happens if a student misses a class?

Students are responsible to find out what they have missed and get any notes and handouts. They are responsible for checking with classmates, Google Classroom, or Ms. Loo when they return, to find out what they have missed.

When can students get Extra help?

Extra help is offered by request at a mutually agreed upon time, usually directly following class when possible.

How will students be assessed?

Outcomes will be assessed through student observation, conversations, and student performance on assignments, entrance/exit slips, quizzes and projects.

A final grade is given at the end of the year in addition to a third term mark. The final grade will be calculated as follows:

- Term 1 - 30%
- Term 2 - 30% (Mid-term Exam)
- Term 3 - 30%
- Exam - 10% (Final exam will be in June)

Levels of Achievement

Outcomes will be assessed multiple times throughout the semester therefore students have multiple opportunities to succeed at each outcome. This allows teachers to pinpoint any misunderstandings and provide students with feedback so they can improve their understanding of the outcome and do better on the next assessment with the same outcome. Outcomes are assessed on a 4 - 1 scale. 1 or 2 are NOT meeting expectations, whereas 3 or 4 are meeting the expectations.
